

EDITO EAU SECOURS !

It was on March 22nd

World Water Day under the aegis of the United Nations highlighted a frightening reality. The results are catastrophic. The world's urban population facing water shortage is expected to reach between 1.7 and 2.4 billion people in 2030. In France, only 7% of the water consumed is used for food, while according to UNICEF, 4,500 children die every day because of poor water quality or lack of sanitary equipment. This shows the urgency and the necessary awareness of an imminent crisis.

The United Nations has been warning about this issue for 30 years, but progress remains insignificant and the

inconsistencies too numerous. Preservation of the resource? Too slow... The oceans represent 72% of the world's surface. And yet less than 1% of the high seas is protected today. This year's World Water Day mobilization is focused on an unavoidable theme, "accelerating the transition ", with a goal of clean water and sanitation by 2030. Big job! 2030 is tomorrow!

To preserve, of course, but also to provide, to expand , but above all to innovate.

The systems in place have already shown their limits. Many of them do not work despite the reports, alerts, studies and other proposed action plans. The shortcomings are there, as shown by the Kenyan episode, to cite just one recent and tragic example.

The issue of the access to water must be at the heart of ecological transition policies.

So what's the solution? Action is daily. Water constitutes 65% of us, it is used to quench our thirst, to wash, to produce, to irrigate, to feed ourselves, to heal, to develop, to live as a matter of fact! The change is necessary. It must be everyone's business', global, driven by the legislators, supported by the communities, developed by companies and start-ups, taken up and spread by citizen.

Mobilization is necessary for respectful technologies and virtuous initiatives, for an equitable access to water. This
